The Intern Foundry (IF) program is a partnership between the Foundry and the University of Nebraska-Lincoln Honors Program that aims to address the "brain drain" in Nebraska. It pairs high-achieving students with work-based learning opportunities in areas of critical community need to cultivate a long-term talent ecosystem among the next generation of community leaders. The program helps build a pipeline of future talent, leadership, and volunteers across Nebraska by connecting students with nonprofits, public sector organizations, and purpose-driven businesses.
















INTERN FOUNDRY IMPACT

The Intern Foundry (IF) program connects hardworking, community-focused UNL Honors students with non-profits, public sector organizations, and purpose-driven businesses to develop a strong pipeline of future talent, leadership, and volunteers in Nebraska. In the spring, the program serves a variety of purpose-driven organizations, while the summer cohort focuses on addressing the most urgent and relevant community needs. The IF program's support and structure are crucial for a successful internship experience for many groups it serves, providing the talent, capacity, and quality work needed to complete essential projects.

Key Outcomes of the Intern Foundry Program



Skill Development

Project management skills, such as planning, communication, time management, and problem-solving, are valuable to students and employers. These skills are useful for many jobs in our state—particularly with nonprofits, public-sector organizations, and purposedriven businesses.



The Power of Mentorship

The strength of the IF program is the collaboration between students and supervisors on meaningful work-based learning projects. With our support, the nonprofits, public-sector organizations, and purpose-driven businesses who support IF can provide this experience to IF interns despite limited capacity.



Building Community Capacity

The Intern Foundry program allows partner nonprofits to undertake projects they otherwise may not be able to complete. It further provides a pipeline for future volunteers and employees invested in the organization's mission and work.



Addressing Brain Drain in Nebraska

The IF program invigorates the community by injecting high-achieving students' creativity and hard work. Experience deeply roots students in the community, increasing the likelihood that they will continue to invest in purpose-driven work, local communities, and the state following graduation.





PROJECT DESCRIPTIONS





Linked2Literacy's annual EMpowerME event serves as an effort to collect \$50,000 in funding for the organization through sponsorships and ticket sales. The role of the intern was to assist in the planning and organization of this vital event. Planning, marketing, communication, and execution were all crucial steps in the success of the event and a great baseline for any future endeavors of the intern.



Our intern assisted in the preparation of Nebraska Arts Advocacy Day, working alongside the executive director. To prepare for the event, the intern had a role in space reservations, preparation of senator introductions, communication with registrants, and assistance on the day of the event. Additionally, the event was spread via social media by the intern to boost awareness of Arts Advocacy Day.



As OutNebraska worked to grow their resource directory to encompass resources from across Nebraska, the intern provided additional research and website updates. The intern was able to connect with a variety of existing organizations to grow their network throughout the project as they worked to help LGBTQ+ community members across the state in accessing resources to improve quality of life.



In preparation for a rapidly growing team, NAMI Nebraska's intern assisted the Executive Director in restructuring the organization. This included centralizing data for fundraising through key statistics Tip Sheets, hiring a new Program Manager, and enhancing the operations of the nonprofit. Executive Director James Michael Bowers remarked, "If [she] wasn't going to law school, I'd make her the Director of Operations!"
